Our goal is to foster competition, teamwork, and skill development through affiliation with local and national amateur athletic organizations. Structure

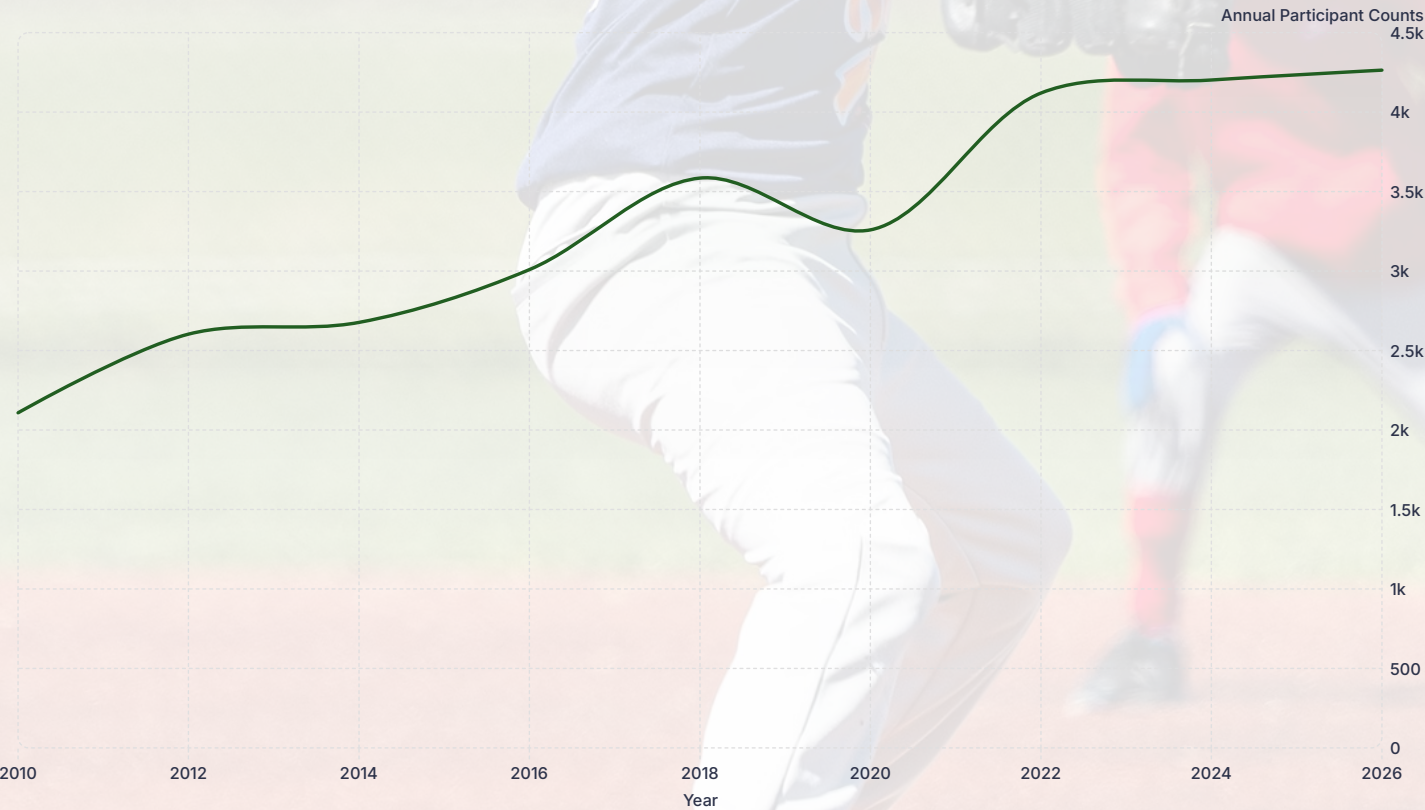
501(c)(3) nonprofit operating on a balanced budget year over year — funded entirely by registration fees, in-kind support, and corporate donors. No public subsidy.

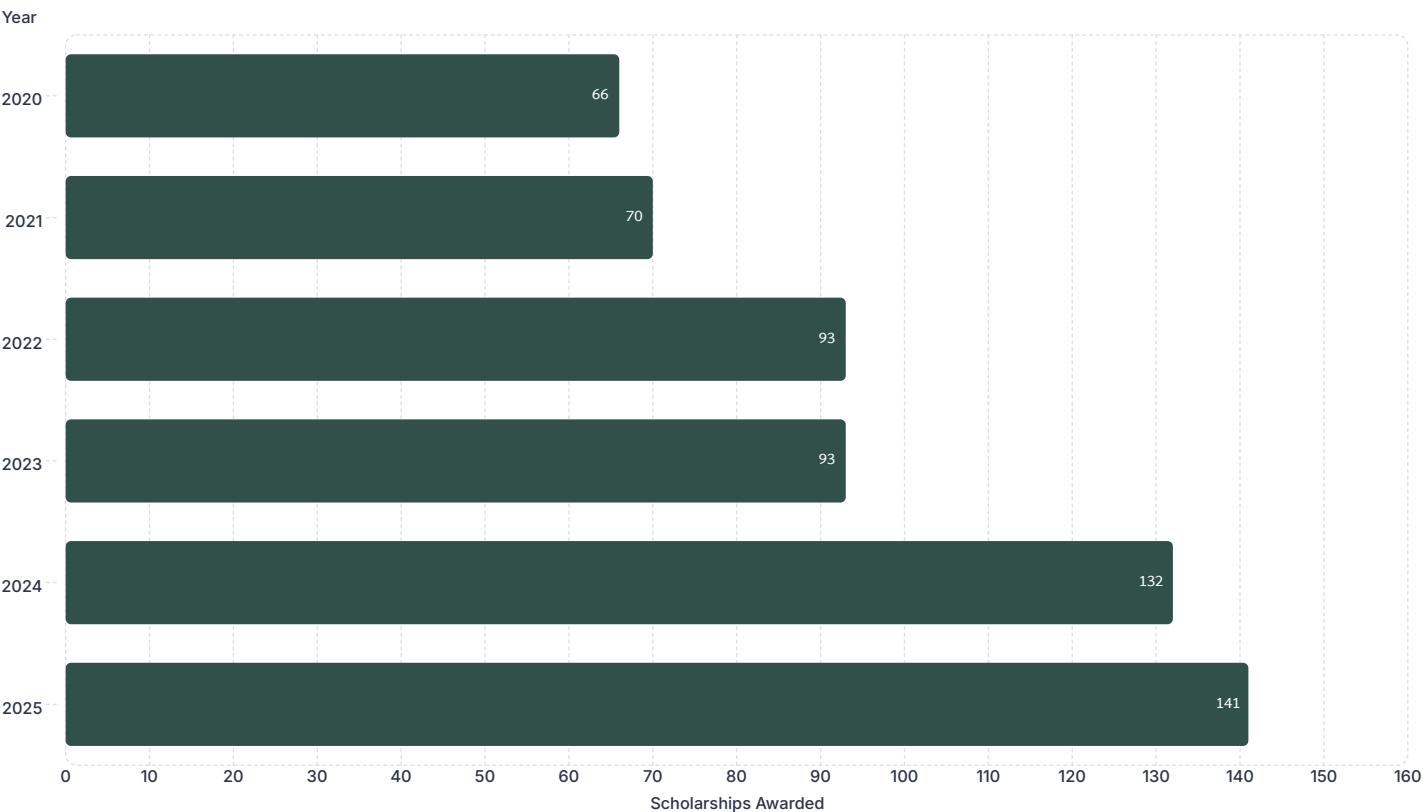

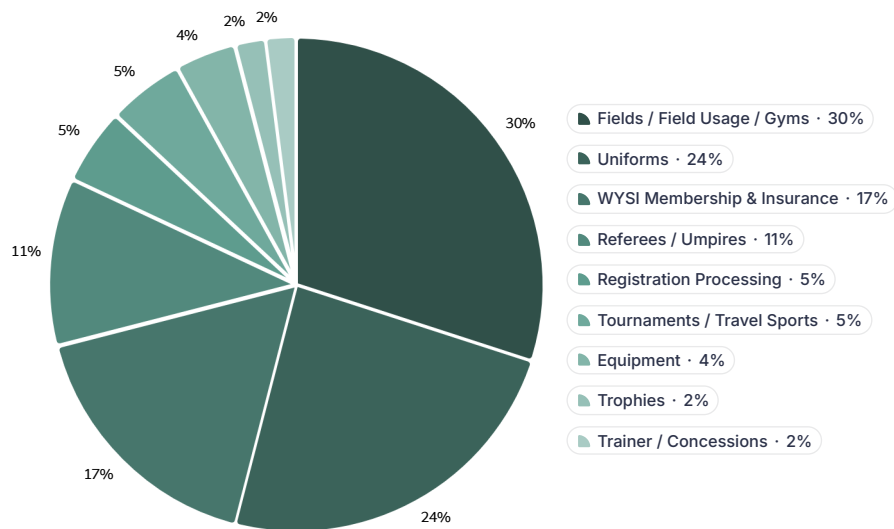
Tucker Swain Memorial College Scholarship

Financial Snapshot

Westfield Youth Sports, Inc. (WYSI) operates as an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. Revenue is generated entirely through participant registration fees, in-kind contributions from community partners, and corporate sponsorships.

Cost Comparisons – Comparable Organizations

WYSI registration fees are among the highest in the region, due to significant facility costs. WYSI pays for all field and gym access across multiple facilities, a cost that many peer organizations in neighboring communities do not carry to the same degree.

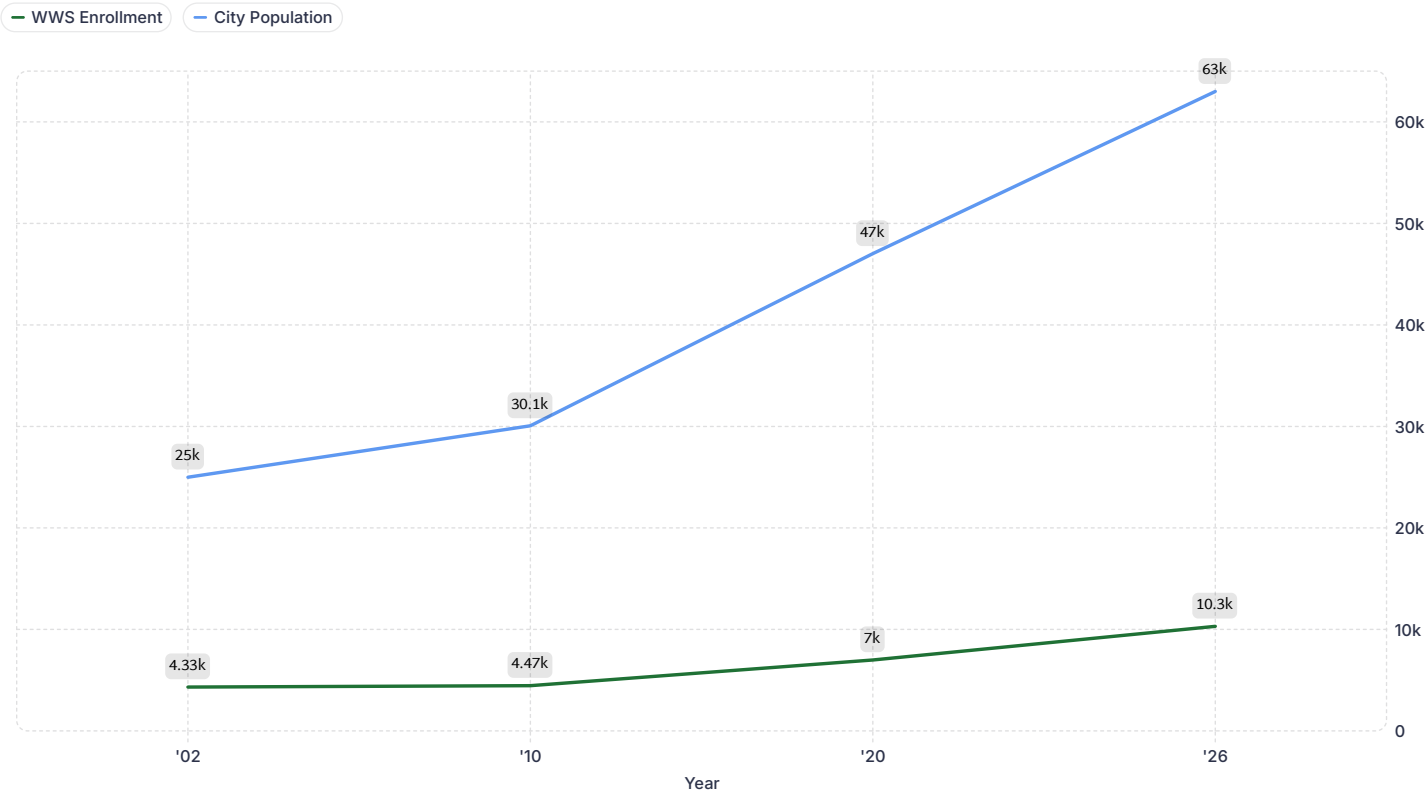
